

## Green Button Product Categories

The Green Button labels sustainably manufactured textiles or products made of textile material (in line with social and environmental criteria) that meet the conditions for product claims defined in the Green Button Standard. The product requirements are verified via one or more recognised certification label(s) (meta-label approach). The Green Button labels finished products that are made up as a declared end product. Excluded are products that are (partly) made of leather as well as toys and fabrics (yard goods). The Green Button Regulations refers to a list of the internationally recognised Nice Classification for the registration of marks, which serves as an orientation for the overview shown.

Essentially, textile products can be assigned to the following four textile segments and product groups. The subgroups allow for a more detailed categorisation, which does not claim to be exhaustive.
